New Facilities for Catterall's Queen Elizabeth II Playing Field

We were delighted to find out, earlier this year, that our application for a grant of £157,528.26 from the Rural Development Programme for England had been successful. We have also been successful in being awarded a grant of £20,000 towards the cost of the first project described below but it is a condition of the grant that we do not announce the name of the grant provider until the work is complete. Together these grants will provide new facilities on the playing field.



The first improvement will be to widen and extend the existing path so that it goes all the way round the playing field. There will also be six "pods" around the path each containing a piece of outdoor fitness equipment. There will be an air walker, an arm and leg strengthener, a sit up board, a multi traction unit, gym dip bars and a leg strengthener.

Work on the path will start on 11 June and we would ask everyone to take extra

care when using the playing field while the work is going on as the ground for the new path will have to be excavated and the surface will be uneven. We are hoping that work on the fitness trail will be completed by mid-July.

The grant will also fund an adventure play area for older children and a wheeled play area. We don't yet have a start date for these projects but we are hoping (weather permitting as always) that both will be in place by autumn.





Chairman's Report

I would like to start this report by personally thanking all councillors for the hard work and commitment they have given over the last twelve months and to welcome our newest councillor Mark Butler. I would especially like to thank Gillian and Tim for their continued hard work and commitment this year and to also thank Graham, the

Pilling Lengthsman, for helping Tim out when needed. Thanks to Jan for the dedicated work she did in securing the funding for the next phase of the Queen Elizabeth II field with additional sports and play facilities.



We are all saddened by the loss of former Councillor John Houghton who had served Catterall for a very long time, not only through the Parish Council but was a leading light in Catterall Gala. We hope to make a lasting memorial in his name in the village.

We set our budget for the 2018/19 financial year in January and, although the precept increased, this seems to have been accepted by residents who, I hope, appreciate they are getting value for money when the next phase of improvements to the Queen Elizabeth II playing field begins.

Remedial work was carried out on the banking of the River Calder earlier this year with trees planted to strengthen the upper bank. I hoped they flourish and protect houses against possible flooding. I wish to express my thanks to Wyre Rivers Trust

and those councillors who gave their time in undertaking this

work.

Thankfully the weather has improved after the long cold winter and I'm looking forward to Netta and her team of 'In Bloomers' making the village look even brighter this year by planting some borders around the area. Hopefully we will be able to show our support to the Catterall bloomers again this year and help them to a gold award!

Planning remains one of our most contentious issues and we are now seeing the start of some major building work in the village, which is already impacting on our daily lives.

Defibrillator for Catterall

You will have noticed the work completed by our Lengthsman Tim and his Pilling colleague Graham at the junction of Garstang Road and Cock Robin Lane. A new defibrillator has been installed and is ready for use when needed.



You must ring 999 and ask for an ambulance you will be directed to your nearest defibrillator if the emergency services believe that one would help the patient.

You will be given a key code to open the defibrillator case door.

Remove the defibrillator and take it to the casualty; open to use and a personal message will talk you through the process and don't panic!

It may just keep the patient alive until the paramedics arrive.

Many thanks to everyone who has helped in raising the money for this vital asset for the village.

Thankfully for the majority all was well, though for some further tests and the prospect of a lifetime of treatment or management of a condition was highlighted by CRY. Difficult times I know, but surely better to know than the alternative of potentially serious heart problems or possible fatality.

Matt's fund has now seen 1000 young people aged 14-35 screened in our locality! We set out to provide one screening weekend and have held five! Such an amazing achievement, but our work continues as we know there are still many who would like to be tested. Fundraising for next year's event is already well underway, and our grateful thanks go to all for the generous support we have received.




