Chairman's Report

The last twelve months have seen us face some very difficult situations and I would like to thank the Councillors for the commitment and support shown over the last year and Gillian and Tim for their hard work and dedicated commitment as the public face of the Parish Council.

It doesn't seem that long ago the World War 1 gate was blessed and now Bloom in Catterall and the Catterall Gardening Club are to help construct a more fitting planted area to display poppies to remember those who gave their lives for us all. They are also starting to do wonderful things around the village and hopefully give Garstang a bit of competition! Stone Cross Garden is starting to take shape and I would like to say thanks to Graham, the Parish Lengthsman from Pilling for helping Tim out with the hard landscaping work.

The Pickerings has been demolished, although no construction work has started. The area does look very different and hopefully it will not become an overgrown eye sore before work commences. The Pickerings grounds always looked so cared for. Recent planning has seen Catterall, along with neighbouring Parishes, take the brunt of large scale applications; I'd like to hope that some joined up common sense approach will prevail in these matters.



The precept has been set and we have kept the increase in line with the standard rate of inflation. We still have the monies from the recent house build in Bowgreave which we are to use for more play equipment on the Queen Elizabeth II playing field, something similar to the one on Kepple Lane, which will be a welcome addition to the children's play area.

The opening of the much anticipated waste

recycling facility at Claughton is getting nearer and we hope that it will be a breath of fresh air for those residents who find it difficult to get to either Preston or Lancaster.

Catterall Parish Precept

Each year a sum of money called the parish precept is collected through your council tax to fund the work of Catterall Parish Council. A budget is calculated showing the amount needed in the Parish and this is subtracting from income. The precept is invested back into your neighbourhood by the Parish Council to improve facilities and services for you and your neighbours. The Parish Council also applies for grants and devolved services from the principal authorities.

The precept is the amount needed to carry out the specified work above.

Estimated Income \pounds 5,420.96 Estimated Payments \pounds 59,454.10 Precept - \pounds 54,033.14 (Rounded to \pounds 54,000)

A household in band D will pay about £68.58 or £1.32 per week, Catterall Parish Council has kept the increase down to 1pence per week.

When we have the various ideas that we are sure will come forward Lancashire County Council will help us to draw up a detailed development plan which we will use to apply for grants and other funding. We will phase the development so that we can get on with things once we have enough money for that phase.

One thing you can be sure of is that any plans will ensure that the Gala will be able to continue using the playing field.

There will be plenty of opportunity for you to tell us what you would like to see happen at the playing field. We will be writing to those residents whose property is adjacent to the playing field and holding public meetings, the first being **Tuesday 9th June in Catterall Village Hall between 2.30 and 4.00 and 6.00 and 8.30pm**, but there's no need to wait.

Or that Brunswick was the name of one of the rows of terraced houses and Pyrmont the name of a cotton mill on the site?
